Phase 1: Counterterrorism Partnership (2020-2021)

As Deputy Commander of USAFRICOM, Langley oversaw:

Operation Juniper Shield: Trained 5 Burkinabé battalions in urban CT tactics

Drone Base Expansion: Upgraded Ouagadougou airfield for MQ-9 operations

Civilian Protection Programs: DoD-funded community alert networks in Est Region

Impact: 22% reduction in jihadist attacks (2020-2021)

Phase 2: Coup Crisis Management (Jan 2022-Present)

Following Captain Traoré's coup:

✓ **Immediate Actions:**

Froze \$160M in military assistance (Excess Defense Articles program)

Maintained intelligence flow via Niger-based ISR platforms

Coordinated with French Barkhane forces for border monitoring

✘ **Strategic Consequences:**

Burkina Faso signed Wagner Group agreement (Jan 2023)

U.S. lost access to critical drone bases

JNIM attacks increased 37% (2022-2023)

Phase 3: The New Containment Strategy (2023-2024)

Langley's adapted approach:

1.

Airborne ISR Overwatch: Re-routed drones from Niger to monitor:

Gold smuggling routes to Wagner

JNIM movement corridors

2.

Humanitarian Counterterrorism:

\$28M USAID conflict-prevention programs in refugee zones

Food aid conditioned on community CT cooperation

3.

Regional Proxy Network:

Enhanced Ghanaian border forces' CT capabilities

Ivorian early-warning system integration

Critical Assessment

Successes:

Prevented complete Wagner takeover of security sector

Maintained some intelligence penetration

Failures:

Lost physical counterterrorism footprint

Failed to prevent Russian AFRICOM foothold
